

Josie Raphaelito, MPH, is a citizen of the Navajo Nation and calls the Ramah Navajo Reservation in New Mexico home. She is German, Swedish and Scandinavian, born for the Meadow People Clan, her maternal grandfather is German, her paternal grandfather's clan is of the Salt Water Clan, this is how she is Diné, Navajo. Josie currently lives in Buffalo, NY and is the Research Project Coordinator at the Center for Indigenous Cancer Research at Roswell Park Comprehensive Cancer Center, and serves as an Independent Consultant specializing in Native youth engagement and leadership, suicide prevention, and general Two-Spirit and Native LGBTQIA+ advocacy and community building. Josie co-authored a 2019 toolkit titled, "Indigenizing Love: A Toolkit for Native Youth to Build Inclusion" and travels nationally to present on and help implement the toolkit in Indigenous communities.

Josie received her Bachelor's of Science degree in Athletic Training from the University of New England, and went on to earn her Masters of Public Health degree from the George Washington University in Washington, DC.
